

## Graduate Certificate in Special Education: Applied Behavior Analysis

Upon offer of admission, the following will be required: Successful passage of FBI criminal background check

## **Admission Criteria**

The following criteria will be used to assess a student's application for admission into the Graduate Certificate in Special Education: Applied Behavior Analysis. No single criterion can adequately predict a student's probable success in graduate work. Applicants should anticipate that the materials they submit will be held to high standards with submission of the following:

- GPA/Transcripts: A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.25 for all graduate work (must have minimum of 9 credits) or for junior and senior years of undergraduate work (based on A = 4.00). Submit transcripts from undergraduate and/or graduate level coursework.
- Letters of Recommendation: Provide two letters of recommendation from professionals in the behavior analytic field (Board Certified Behavior Analysts, faculty members, and/or supervisors of behavior analytic employment). These letters need to specifically address behavior analytic employment, coursework, and/or interest.
- 3. **Resume:** Provide an updated resume highlighting your professional experiences with applied behavior analysis.
